Supreme Court of Canada (Statutory Court)

<i>Mercer v AGC</i> (1881)	Provinces are corporations; Queen stole Gold and Silver Indian Trust = 50% of Resources
<i>St. Catherine's Milling</i> (1887)	Indigenous never surrendered Quebec.
<i>Calder v AGBC</i> (1973).	Nation to Nation
<i>R v Guerin</i> (1984)	<i>Sui generis</i> title / No Doctrine of Discovery by Crown
<i>Lavigne v Ontario</i> (2002).	Rand Doctrine: cannot compel taxes for war etc.
<i>Canson v Boughton</i> (1991)	Judge's powers to reach for Bill in Equity
<i>Delgamuukw v BC</i> (1997)	Indigenous Laws are EQUAL
<i>Haida v BC</i> (2003)	Duty to Consult; Land subject to prior Indigenous title; Duty to Protect
<i>Tsilhqot'in v BC</i> (2014)	Duty to Consult [78] / Crown Duty to Protect [25:
<i>Daniels v Canada</i> (2016)	Recognized Non Status and Metis, who are federal
<i>Williams Lake v BC</i> (2018)	Canada breached its Fiduciary Duty pre and post Confederation ; Land Trust can be collapsed and returned to Indigenous Clan Mothers.

<i>Vuckovich v RBC</i> (1997)	The Debtor Financial Institution owns the Deposit
<i>Benedict v Owistha</i> (2014)	Indians Band Corporations are NOT Indians
<i>Paulus v Fleury</i> (2018)	Limit to Absolute Privilege
<i>Georgina v Blanchard</i> (2020) (Appealed by Indigenous to SCC with <i>R v Paquin/Cardin</i>)	Feldman Panel recognizes Land Claim at [16]
